COMES NOW, the GUAM POWER AUTHORITY (GPA), by and through its counsel of record, D. GRAHAM BOTHA, ESQ., and hereby files GPA's Petition for the Public Utilities Commission of Guam to review and approve GPA's request for approval of the amendment to the contract for Residual Fuel Oil No. 6 for the Baseload Power Generating Plants, as follows:

BACKGROUND

The Guam Power Authority awarded a contract for Residual Fuel Oil (RFO) to Hyundai Corporation for an initial three (3) year period which will expire on August 31, 2023. The CCU in Resolution 2021-19 approved GPA's request to enter into a contract amendment with Huyndai Corporation for the supply of 0.2% ULSFO commencing on or about January 1, 2022. The Consent Decree with USEPA requires GPA to substitute the LSFO and HSFO and transition to Ultra-Low Sulfur Fuel Oil ("ULSFO") with a sulfur limit of 0.2% by weight, no later than December 31, 2021.

DISCUSSION

GPA hereby petitions the PUC, pursuant to the Contract Review Protocol for the Guam Power Authority, approved by the PUC, to review and approve the contract amendment with Hyundai Corporation for 0.2% sulfur Residual Fuel Oil No. 6 for the Baseload Power Generating

Plants. In support of this Petition, GPA hereby provides the PUC with Consolidated Commission on Utilities (CCU) Resolution No. 2021-19, which authorizes the General Manager to proceed with the contract amendment with Hyundai Corporation for 0.2% sulfur Residual Fuel Oil No. 6 for the Baseload Power Plants. Said resolution and its exhibits are attached herein as Exhibit A, and incorporated by reference herein as if fully set forth.

CONCLUSION

The PUC should approve GPA's request to proceed with the amendment to the contract to Hyundai Corporation for 0.2% sulfur Residual Fuel Oil No. 6 for the Baseload Power Plants. Residual Fuel Oil is essential to the operation of the Cabras power plants, and a contract amendment is reasonable, prudent, and necessary.

27	WHEREAS, the Fixed Premium Fee for the 0.2% ULSFO is \$79.000 per metric ton, linked to the Gasoil
28	10pm commodity posted on the Platts APAG Marketscan Report; and

WHEREAS, the estimated Fixed Premium Fee cost for the 0.2% ULSFO based on the estimated commodity price and annual supply quantity of 1,500,000 barrels (235,849 metric tons) has a value of approximately \$18,632,075 per year; and WHEREAS, GPA has determined that the Fixed Premium Fee for the 0.2% ULSFO is reasonable and provides the lowest cost for the Authority; and WHEREAS, the estimated contract unit cost for the 0.2% ULSFO based on the estimated commodity price of \$80.710 per barrel (or \$601.290 per metric ton @ 7.45 bbl/MT) plus the Fixed Premium Fee of \$79.000 per metric ton is equivalent to \$680.290 per metric ton. The estimated annual contract cost based on the estimated annual supply quantity has a value of approximately \$160,445,636 per year; and WHEREAS, the supply of the 0.2% ULSFO is anticipated to commence in January 01, 2022; and NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the CONSOLIDATED COMMISSION ON UTILITIES as the governing body of GPA, and subject to the review and approval of the Public Utilities Commission as follows: 1. The General Manager of the Guam Power Authority is hereby authorized to enter into a contract amendment with HYUNDAI CORPORATION for the supply of 0.2% ULSFO commencing on or about January 01, 2022. 2. The General Manager of the Guam Power Authority is hereby authorized an increase in obligating authority to the annual value of the contract estimated at \$160,445,636 per year and execute such agreements and documents necessary for a contract with HYUNDAI CORPORATION. RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Commission certifies and the Board Secretary attests the adoption of this Resolution.
