Teleguam Holdings, LLC, ("GTA") hereby petitions the Guam Public Utilities Commission ("GPUC") to grant its certification under 47 C.F.R. § 54.314 and find that GTA is in compliance with Section 254(e) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996 and that it is receiving federal universal support for which that support is intended. In addition, GTA further certifies that all federal high-cost support received in accordance with 47 C.F.R. § 54.314(b) will be used only for the provision, maintenance, and upgrading of facilities and services for which the support is intended. As demonstrated below, GTA meets all of the required Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") requirements and requests a positive certification be provided by the GPUC before September 30, 2021 for filing to the Universal Service Administration Company ("USAC") and the FCC.

#### I. INTRODUCTION

Section 254(e) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996 provides that carriers receiving Federal Universal Service Support "shall use that support only for the provision, maintenance, and upgrading of facilities and services for which the support was intended." Under FCC rules, state public utility commissions must certify annually to USAC that all eligible communication carriers in the state comply with this requirement. In addition, on March 17, 2005, the FCC released the ETC Designation Order under CC Docket No. 96-46, Report and Order, FCC 05-46, making recommendation to state commission to implement certification guidelines for carriers designated as Eligible Telecommunications Carriers ("ETC") pursuant to Section 214(e)(6).

The FCC designated nine core services that are eligible for Universal Service Fund ("USF") support: single party service; local usage; voice grade access to the public switched telephone network; dual tone multifrequency signaling; access to emergency services; access to operator services; access to interexchange services; access to directory assistance; and toll limitation service for qualifying low-income consumers.

In addition, under FCC 05-46 the FCC recommended that state commission set additional information requests on an annual basis for carriers seeking designation as an ETC progress report on the ETC's five year service quality improvement plan; detailed information on any outage lasting at least thirty minutes; the number of requests for service from potential customers that were unfulfilled for the past year; the number of complaints per 1,000 handsets or landlines; certifications that the ETC is complying with applicable service quality standards; certification that ETC is able to function in emergency situation; certifications that ETC is offering a local usage plan that is comparable to the incumbent LEC, and certification that the carrier acknowledge that the Commission may require it to provide equal access.

#### II. GTA COMPLIANCE WITH CORE UNIVERSAL SERVICE OFFERINGS

In accordance with 47 C.F.R. § 54.101 GTA provides all the core services that are designated for support for USF support. GTA provides many of the core services as part of basic residential and business local line service under its General Exchange Tariff approved by the GPUC. Specifically, through GTA's tariff its customers are able to purchase single party, unlimited local usage telephone service that utilized dual tone multifrequency signaling. In addition, GTA provides access to 911 and regularly makes updates to the appropriate ANI/ALI database as well as access to operator services, directory assistance and access to interexchange services. Lastly for those low-income customers, GTA provides toll limitation for domestic and international toll calls.

#### III. GTA'S COMPLIANCE WITH ETC DESIGNATION ORDER

GTA, in its desire to provide as much detail as possible, offers the following comments on its designation of compliance with FCC 05-46. GTA is not aware of the GPUC implementing these requirements through a formal proceeding, however GTA wishes to take a proactive position and offer as much detail as possible in this petition.

- (1) Progress report on the ETC's five year service quality improvement plan. GTA respectfully submits its filing for a five-year service quality improvement plan under Exhibit A. GTA requests that it be granted the largest latitude possible in preparing to provide this information, as has not gone through a formal process for this requirement.
- (2) <u>Detailed information on any outage lasting at least thirty minutes.</u> GTA had one (1) outage that affected the landline service.
  - 6/17/2021: 911 routing issue towards Agana C20 (Current GovGuam 911 system is only connected to Agana C20 due to legacy MF AMI trunk interface on 911 platform)
  - Cause: SS7 Signaling Failure
  - Duration: 65 minutes
  - Impact: Call failures to 911 from external networks traversing GTA Agana C20
  - Fix: Implemented new 911 routes for additional redundancy towards GTA Agana C20 for 911 calls. Additional routes are ISDN vs SS& and do not rely on SS7 for call completion.
- (3) The number of requests for service from potential customers that were unfulfilled for the past year. The requests GTA was unable to fulfill were due to the subscriber's inability to pay the required deposits for delivery of service or service drops for new subscribers.
- (4) The number of complaints per 1,000 handsets or lines. During calendar year 2020 and to date 2021, GTA was not made aware of any end user complaints filed with the GPUC or any other regulatory body.
- (5) <u>Certification that the ETC is complying with applicable service quality standards.</u> GTA certifies that it adheres to applicable GPUC service quality standards and FCC rules and orders.
- (6) <u>Certification that ETC is able to function in emergency situations.</u> GTA certifies that it has the ability to remain functional in emergency situations. Through the use of its backup electricity generators, buried copper and fiber plant, and backup battery power at its Central Office and Remote Equipment Centers, GTA has the necessary infrastructure and equipment to remain functional in situations that include fires, earthquakes or typhoons.

- (7) <u>Certification that the ETC is offering a local usage plan that is comparable to the incumbent LEC.</u> GTA is the incumbent LEC and offers an unlimited local usage plan to its subscribers.
- (8) <u>Certification that the carrier acknowledges that the Commission may require it to provide equal access.</u> GTA currently offers equal access to all of its subscribers and therefore in compliance with this requirement.
- (9) GTA complies with all Consumer Proprietary Network Information (CPNI) and customer privacy, including local laws relating to consumer protection.

GTA certifies that as a designated ETC it has offered all of the service designated by the FCC for support to pursuant to Section 254(c) of the Federal Act during calendar year 2020 and to date 2021 in compliance with 47 C.F.R. § 54.101. GTA also certifies that it has advertised the ability of supported services and the charges through general media distribution including the direct mailing, Internet, newspaper advertising, and radio. Specifically, GTA ran advertisements in the Guam Daily Post and Guam PDN, as well as provides information on its website for such services including lifeline services.

#### IV. GTA USE OF ELIGIBLE FUNDS

GTA continues to target and remain committed to use its budgets to continue to enhance its network including investments in the outside plant and invest in new technology for Guam. GTA respectfully submits in Exhibit B its audited financial data for 2019 for demonstration that all of the funds are being used to support core services. In *calendar year 2020, GTA received \$7,393,602* in Broadband Loop Support (CAF/BLS) and \$4,095,148 in *calendar year 2021 to date* in Broadband Loop Support, and \$266,442 in calendar year 2020 and \$209,606 in calendar year 2021 to date in Interstate Carrier Compensation (BLS/ICC).

#### V. CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, GTA respectfully requests that a positive certification be granted by the GPUC and forwarded to the FCC before September 30, 2021. GTA respectfully requests that this petition be given priority at the earliest convenience.




#### TeleGuam Holdings LLC's Ability to Function in Emergency Situations

TeleGuam Holdings LLC ("Company") hereby certifies that it is able to function in emergency situations as set forth in §54.201(a)(2). The Company's voice and broadband network is designed to remain functional in emergency situations without an external power source, is able to reroute traffic around damaged facilities, and is capable of managing traffic spikes resulting from emergency situations as required by Section 54.202(a)(2). The Company can change call routing translations as needed to reroute traffic around damaged facilities. Changing call routing translations will also allow the Company to manage traffic spikes throughout its network, as emergency situations require.

Specifically, each central office building is supplied with standby generators and battery back-up that enable the central office to keep running until power is restored so long as fuel is available, or until system changes are made to reroute traffic. The Company has battery backup at all office locations and in its electronic equipment sites. Length of run time is determined by the equipment serving the area and the number of customers working out of the equipment. Generators are installed at all Central Office locations. They will continue to run as long as the Company has access to fuel. The Company complies with the FCC's backup power requirements, effective October 16, 2015.

Section 54.201(a)(2) requires ETCs that are designated by the Commission to "demonstrate its ability to remain functional in emergency situations, including a demonstration that it has a reasonable amount of back-up power to ensure functionality without an external power source, is able to reroute traffic around damaged facilities, and is capable of managing traffic spikes resulting from emergency situations."
