PETITION FOR CONTRACT REVIEW

COMES NOW, the GUAM POWER AUTHORITY (GPA), by and through its counsel of record, D. GRAHAM BOTHA, ESQ., and hereby files GPA's Petition for the Public Utilities Commission of Guam to review and approve GPA's request to approve the month-to-month extension for Professional Printing, Mailing, and Processing Services with Graphic Center, Inc., as follows:

BACKGROUND

The Guam Power Authority on May 13, 2021, GPA issued RFP No. GPA-RFP-21-002 for the re-solicitation of Professional Printing, Mailing, and Processing Services relating to Utility Customer Billing. The losing bidder, Graphic Center filed an appeal with the OPA, and on March 25, 2022, the OPA denied Graphic Center's appeal. On April 5, 2022, Graphic Center filed an appeal of the OPA decision with the Superior Court. The CCU in Resolution FY2022-20 has approved GPA's request to approve a month-to-month extension for approximately \$300,000 for one year for Professional Printing, Mailing, Processing and Other Services with Graphic Center, Inc., subject to PUC approval. The month-to-month extension will continue until a new contract is awarded and implemented after completion of the appeal process.

DISCUSSION

GPA hereby petitions the PUC, pursuant to the Contract Review Protocol for the Guam Power Authority, approved by the PUC, to review and approve the month-to-month extension for Professional Printing, Mailing, Processing and Other Services with Graphic Center, Inc. at an additional cost of \$300,000 for one year. In support of this Petition, GPA hereby provides the PUC with Consolidated Commission on Utilities (CCU) Resolution No. FY2022-20, which authorizes the General Manager to petition the PUC for approval of the month-to-month extension for Professional Printing, Mailing, Processing and Other Services with Graphic Center, Inc., subject to PUC review and approval. Said resolution and its exhibits are attached herein as Exhibit A, and incorporated by reference herein as if fully set forth.

CONCLUSION

The PUC should approve GPA's request to approve the month-to-month extension for Professional Printing, Mailing, Processing and Other Services with Graphic Center, Inc. The printing services are necessary for GPA monthly billings, and is reasonable, prudent, and necessary.

AUTHORIZING MANAGEMENT OF THE GUAM POWER AUTHORITY TO ENTER TO A MONTH-TO-MONTH EXTENSION FOR ITS PROFESSIONAL PRINTING, MAILING, PROCESSING AND OTHER SERVICES DUE TO ONGOING PROCUREMENT APPEAL

WHEREAS, on April 6, 2016, the Guam Power Authority (GPA) entered into a contract with Graphic Center, Inc. to provide professional printing, mailing and processing services of approximately 50,000 electric power billings each month; and

WHEREAS, the original contract became effective on April 18, 2016 for a one (1) year period from the date of award of the contract with the option to extend the contract for four (4) additional one-year periods; and

WHEREAS, GPA has exercised its base and options years of the contract and GPA had issued an Invitation for Bid (IFB) for these services but the bidder did not meet the bid requirements which necessitated a re-bid; and

WHEREAS, on April 27, 2021, the Consolidated Commission on Utilities authorized the management of GPA to exercise month-to-month services up to eight (8) months or when a new contract is awarded whichever comes first; and

WHEREAS, on May 13, 2021, GPA issued Request for Proposal No. GPA-RFP-21-002 for the Re-Solicitation of Professional Printing, Mailing and Processing Services Relating to Utility Customer Billing; and

WHEREAS, on June 7, 2021, bids were received from three vendors and one was rejected due to not meeting the required information. On August 18, 2021, GPA notified Graphic Center that InfoSend was selected as the best qualified offeror and notified Moonlight BPO that its proposal was disqualified and rejected; and

WHEREAS, on August 30, 2021, Graphic Center filed an agency-level protest. In their protest, Graphic Center disputed the evaluation scores given to them and InfoSend. On October 7, 2021, GPA denied Graphic Center's protest; and

WHEREAS, on October 22, 2021, Graphic Center filed a procurement appeal with the Office of Public Accountability (OPA) and alleged that InfoSend's absence of a demonstrated record and development system cannot score higher on the evaluation criteria when compared to Graphic Center's demonstrated record of service to GPA for five years; and

WHEREAS, on March 25, 2022, the OPA ruled its Decision denying Graphic Center's appeal. Parties had a right to appeal the Public Auditor's Decision to the Superior Court of Guam within fourteen (14) days after receipt of a Final Administrative Decision; and

WHEREAS, on April 5, 2022, Graphic Center filed an appeal of the Public Auditor's Decision to the Superior Court of Guam; and

WHEREAS, GPA must have the printing services in order to issue monthly billings which is the revenue lifeline of GPA; and

WHEREAS, in April 2021, the CCU approved GPA's initial extension request of monthto-month service up to eight months of the current contract or until an award is made via Resolution 2021-10; and

WHEREAS, GPA again seeks a month-to-month extension for approximately \$300,000 up to when a new contract is awarded and implemented in the event a new vendor is selected; and
