**PETITION FOR CONTRACT REVIEW**

**COMES NOW**, the GUAM POWER AUTHORITY (GPA), by and through its counsel of record, D. GRAHAM BOTHA, ESQ., and hereby files GPA's Petition for the Public Utilities Commission of Guam to review and approve GPA's request for approval of the revision of the GPA Line Extension Policy, as follows:

**BACKGROUND**

The current Guam Power Authority line extension policy in 28 GAR §3136 provides that private or government owned electric lines beyond the service delivery point must be constructed and maintained without expense to the Authority. It provides that a new customer for a line extension may be partially refunded if additional customers connect within five (5) years from the date the extension is ready for service. The proposed revision proposes to modify the line extension policy from 5 to 15 years to allow additional time for existing and future customers who pay for a line extension to be partially refunded if additional customers connect to the line extension within that period. The CCU in Resolution FY2023-08 has approved GPA's request for approval of the revision of the GPA Line Extension Policy.

**DISCUSSION**

GPA hereby petitions the PUC, pursuant to the Contract Review Protocol for the Guam




1 Power Authority, approved by the PUC, to review and approve the revision of the GPA Line  
2 Extension Policy. In support of this Petition, GPA hereby provides the PUC with Consolidated  
3 Commission on Utilities (CCU) Resolution No. FY2023-08, which authorizes the General  
4 Manager to proceed with the revision of the GPA Line Extension Policy. Said resolution and its  
5 exhibits are attached herein as Exhibit A, and incorporated by reference herein as if fully set  
6 forth.

7 **CONCLUSION**

8 The PUC should approve GPA's request to proceed with the revision of the GPA Line  
9 Extension Policy. A revision to allow an extension from 5 to 15 years is reasonable, prudent,  
10 and necessary.

**RELATIVE TO REVISION OF THE GPA LINE EXTENSION POLICY**

**WHEREAS**, the Guam Power Authority (GPA) line extension policy is set forth in 28 GAR §3136 and 3139, which provides that private or government owned electric lines beyond the service delivery point must be constructed and maintained without expense to the Authority; and

**WHEREAS**, the current line extension policy provides that payment made by the new customer for a line extension may be partially refunded if additional customers connect within five (5) years from the date the extension is ready for service; and

**WHEREAS**, the GPA proposes to modify the line extension policy from five (5) to fifteen (15) years to allow additional time for existing and future customers who pay for a line extension to be partially refunded if additional customers connect to the line extension within that period.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Consolidated Commission on Utilities, subject to the approval of the Public Utilities Commission, as follows:

1. The General Manager of GPA is authorized to obtain legislative approval or PUC approval to change the current GPA line extension policy set forth in 28 GAR.

**RESOLVED**, that the Chairman certifies and the Board Secretary attests the adoption of this Resolution.

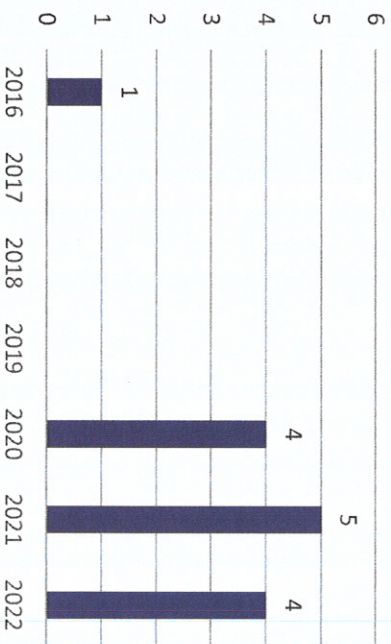




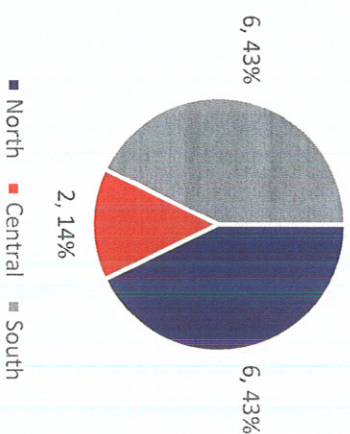
