I. Introduction.

The Guam Power Authority (GPA) hereby files its Petition for the Public Utilities Commission of Guam (PUC) to review and approve GPA's FY2026 revenue funded Capital Improvement Project (CIP) ceiling cap, which consists of General Plant (\$7,914,485), Engineering (\$7,260,188), and Line Extensions (\$5,825,327) for a total internal FY2026 CIP ceiling cap of \$21,000,000.

II. Background.

Paragraph 6 of the PUC's Contract Review Protocol for GPA requires GPA to file every year by mid-September its revenue funded CIP ceiling cap for the upcoming fiscal year plus estimates for the subsequent two fiscal years. The FY2026-2027 budget, which includes revenue funded CIP projects for FY2026, was approved by the Consolidated Commission on Utilities (CCU) by GPA Resolution No. FY2025-25 on August 26, 2025. See Ex. 1 (GM's Letter (Sept. 5,

2025)), Attach. B (CCU Resolution No. FY25-25). The FY2026 budget has revenue funded CIP projects and consists of General Plant (\$7,914,485), Engineering (\$7,260,188), and Line Extensions (\$5,825,327). The total projected FY2026 budget for revenue funded CIP projects is \$21,000,000. GPA is requesting that it be approved as the FY2026 CIP ceiling cap.

III. Discussion.

GPA hereby petitions the PUC, pursuant to its Contract Review Protocol GPA, to review and approve GPA's FY2026 internal CIP ceiling cap of \$21,000,000. In support of this petition, GPA hereby provides the PUC with the General Manager's letter to the PUC dated September 5, 2025, and attachments detailing the FY2026 CIP ceiling cap. The letter and its exhibits are attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated by reference herein as if fully set forth. *See* Ex. 1 (GM's Letter) & Attachs. A (General Plant), A.1 (Engineering), & B (CCU Resolution).

IV. Conclusion.

The PUC should approve GPA's request to approve GPA's FY2026 revenue funded CIP ceiling cap, which consists of General Plant (\$7,914,485), Engineering (\$7,260,188), and Line Extensions (\$5,825,327) with a total internal FY2026 CIP ceiling cap of \$21,000,000, as it is reasonable, prudent, and necessary.
